Welcome to the October 2024 OSFM Engineering Newsletter. This Newsletter is meant to update our readers on the most recent Building Code Council meeting results and the status of the 2024 North Carolina Building Code adoption and implementation status.

Current Topics

2024 North Carolina State Building Code

As per a vote by the North Carolina Building Code Council at their 9/10/24 meeting, the 2023 NFPA 70 (2023 NC Electrical Code, 2024 NC Residential Code and 2024 NC Administrative Code and Policies will be mandatorily effective 1/1/25. The 2017 NFPA 70 (2017 NC Electrical Code) is effective for buildings and structures included within the scope of the 2018 NC Residential Code through 12/31/24. The 2020 NFPA 70 (2020 NC Electrical Code) is effective for buildings and structures not included within the scope of the 2018 NC Residential Code through 12/31/24. The 2018 NC Administrative Code and Policies is effective through 12/31/24.

Also, the 2024 NC Building Code, NC Existing Building Code, NC Fire Code, NC Mechanical Code, NC Fuel Gas Code and NC Plumbing Code will be effective for use on 1/1/25 and mandatorily effective on 7/1/25. A 6-month overlap period was granted to continue using the 2018 NC Building Code, NC Existing Building Code, NC Fire Code, NC Mechanical Code, NC Fuel Gas Code and NC Plumbing Code is effective until 6/30/25. During the 6-month overlap period, use of the 2018 NC Building Code, NC Existing Building Code, NC Fire Code, NC Mechanical Code, NC Fuel Gas Code and NC Plumbing Code in their entirety for project permits or use of the 2024 NC Building Code, NC Existing Building Code, NC Fire Code, NC Mechanical Code, NC Fuel Gas Code and NC Plumbing Code in their entirety for project permits is permitted.

The 2024 NC Energy Conservation Code is under legislative review for review in the NC General Assembly long-session in 2025 and so the 2018 NC Energy Conservation Code will remain effective until further notice.

A letter from the North Carolina Building Code Council will be issued to public as soon as possible outlining this information.

It is anticipated books being available in November from the publisher once that process is completed.

A2L Refrigerants

There are no technical updates on the industry switchover to A2L refrigerants since the June 2024 A2L newsletter edition, available on the NC OSFM website.

Please note that, regardless of final deadlines for installation of non-A2L air conditioning systems, manufacturers are, and have been, switching over production to A2L refrigerant-containing equipment for some time now, so there are no guarantees non-A2L systems will be commercially available for any given project.

The full review of the approved code amendments is left to the reader, but **the titles of each D-item** are bulleted below. Remember these are not final until they are through the Rules Review process. The approved December D-items, if approved by Rules Review Commission, will be effective January 1, 2025 for items pertaining to the Commercial Building Code.

BCC Proposed Amendments-September 10th 2024

- Item D 1 Request from Phillip Scott of BFPE International to amend the 2024 NC Fire Code, Section 510.1 Emergency responder communication coverage in new buildings, Exception #4 as follows (240319 Item B-1): (Remainder not shown for brevity) Tabled to December 2024 meeting. Item D-1 requires a fiscal note to be approved by the NC Office of State Budget Management per the 8/15/2024 Page 11 of 13 requirements of N.C.G.S 143-138(a1)(1). A fiscal note has not been provided by the proponent by the date of the agenda printing, 8/15/2024.
- Item D 2 Request from Adam Smith representing Carolina's Association of RV Parks and Campgrounds to amend the 2023 NC Electrical Code, Section 210.8 Ground-Fault Circuit-Interrupter Protection for Personnel, (F) Outdoor Outlets as follows (240319 Item B-2): (Remainder not shown for brevity) Denied. Of note, a following petition has been submitted by OSFM staff to achieve the intended goal of this petition.

• Item D − 3 Request from David Rittlinger representing staff to amend the 2024 edition of the North Carolina Administrative Code and Policies, Table 202.5 and Appendix C as follows (240319 Item B-4): (Remainder not shown for brevity) − Adopted and sent to the Rules Review Commission for their consideration

As of this writing, (October 2024) all code volumes have been approved by the Rules Review Commission (RRC). The 2024 NC Energy Conservation Code (NCECC) is on hold pending a legislative review in the long session in 2025 unless executive or legislative action is taken in advance. The 2018 NCECC with NC amendments will remain in effect until further notice.

Here is a status as of 9/27/24 of the 2024 NC Building Codes publication schedule and the RRC approval process.

and-2 family dwellings)	were received by the RRC so this code is under legislative review in the 2025 long session. The effective date of this is unknown at this time.

Remember, the Residential standing committee had introduced (in the March 2023 meeting) a submittal that would keep the Chapter 11 (Energy), Chapters 12-23 (Mechanical) and Chapter 24 (Fuel Gas) the same as the 2018 version of the NC Residential Code. As noted in the previous newsletter, NCGS Session Law 2023-108 prohibits further action on several of the code volumes and combinations of code volumes that were being considered by the Building Code Council. The list of codes in Table 1 reflect the limitations of the statutes.
