
EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Fiscal Year 2022-2023

The Board has a stated goal to "provide a pool of qualified code officials." The total number of active Code Enforcement Officials (CEOs) is a Key Performance Indicator (KPI). As of June 30, there were **4,549** active CEOs. This is 413 (10%) more than FYE 2022, 4,136.

"How many inspectors are needed to perform requested inspection within two business days?" NCDOI seeks assistance through the Office of Strategic Partnerships for a research partner to answer this question through their project portal. Such a project remains unfunded and without a partner. <u>https://projectportal.nc.gov/project/doi_inspectors</u>

Recent years have seen an attrition of inspectors "aging out" or retiring with projections showing a significant loss in the available workforce. Current age distribution for all active status inspectors across all TYPES, TRADES and LEVELS. 600 inspectors over 60 years of age.



Budget

N.C. Gen. Stat. § 143-151.16 states the Board shall establish a schedule of fees to be paid by each applicant for certification and such fee shall not exceed \$20, annual renewal application fee not to exceed \$10 and late renewal fee of \$4. N.C. Gen. Stat. § 151.21 states that fees collected shall be credited to the Insurance Regulatory Fund. [Note: there is no agency rule schedule of fees.]

11. S.B. 463 PART II AND III

PART II. CLARIFY THAT INDIVIDUALS WITH CERTAIN PROFESSIONAL OR OCCUPATIONAL LICENSES MAY OBTAIN STANDARD CERTIFICATES BY ONLY PASSING STANDARD EXAMINATIONS

SECTION 2. G.S. 143-151.13 reads as rewritten:

"§ 143-151.13. Required standards and certificates for Code-enforcement officials.

(f) The Board shall issue a standard certificate to any person who is currently licensed to practice as $\frac{a(n):any}{any}$ of the following, provided the person successfully passes the examination required under subsection (a) of this section:

- (1) Architect, registered pursuant to Chapter 83A; Chapter 83A.
- (2) General contractor, licensed pursuant to Article 1 of Chapter 87; Chapter 87.
- (3) Plumbing or heating contractor, licensed pursuant to Article 2 of Chapter 87;Chapter 87.
- (4) Electrical contractor, licensed pursuant to Article 4 of Chapter 87; or, Chapter 87.
- (5) Professional engineer, registered pursuant to Chapter 89C;Chapter 89C.

provided the person successfully completes a short course, as prescribed by the Board, relating to the State Building Code regulations and Code-enforcement administration. The standard certificate shall authorize the person to practice as a qualified Code-enforcement official in a particular type of position at the level determined by the Board, based on the type of license or registration held in any profession specified above." PART III. AUTHORIZE THE CODE OFFICIALS' QUALIFICATION BOARD TO CHARGE FEES FOR THE REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT COURSES AND SPONSORS

SECTION 3. G.S. 143-151.13A reads as rewritten:

"§ 143-151.13A. Professional development program for officials.<u>officials</u>; course sponsor <u>fees.</u>

(g) Each course sponsor shall pay to the Board a fee of one dollar (\$1.00) per approved credit hour per individual who successfully completes a course under the provisions of this section.

(h) At the time a course sponsor submits an application to the Board for approval of a course under the provisions of this section, the sponsor shall pay to the Commissioner a filing fee of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per course up to a two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) per calendar year maximum.

(i) <u>An official who selects a course other than one offered by an approved course sponsor</u> and who seeks approval of the course pursuant to rules adopted by the Board shall, upon approval of the course, pay a fee of one dollar (\$1.00) per approved credit hour."

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
NCDOI Marketplace: The following companies expressed interest in or are actively having employees apply for NCCOQB certification: <u>SAFEbuilt®</u>, <u>Bureau Veritas</u>, <u>RCI of SC, Inc.</u>, <u>CC&I Services</u>, LLC, <u>ECS Southeast</u>, <u>LLP</u>. RFP #12-001219 was issued January 10, 2023 and the proposed opening date was extended by addendum from February 7 to February 21. The contract award date was February 24 with an effective date of March 1, 2023. However, only two proposals were submitted that did not fully respond to the RFP requirements and no award has been made to date.


Housing Units Permit Activity

It is clear from the following charts that housing construction remains near record levels driving the demand for inspections. See Total Units in first chart and Top counts of single-family units in in second chart.






CERTIFICATION


Staff is requesting that Code officials earning a Standard Certificate from May 1 through June 30 be exempt from that year's continuing education and renewal fee requirements – which are due by July 1. It can be exceedingly difficult for Code officials receiving a Standard Certificate on or after May 1 to have adequate time to complete the six-hour continuing education requirement for renewals in that time frame. Additionally, this change would prevent multiple renewal fee payments when higher level certification(s) are issued during this period.

Prequalify – This option is available to anyone not currently employed by a jurisdiction and allows staff determination of the Trade(s)/Level(s) of certification that an applicant may be issued upon completion of all education and experience requirements.

Applications – Total numbers have steadily increased since 2012 with the exception of 2020/2021 during the COVID-19 pandemic. Fiscal Year Ending 2023 surpassed FY 2022 applications by June 30.

Certificates – There are three Types of certificates:

1) **Probationary** that have a duration of three years and may not be renewed.

2) **Standard** certificates must be renewed annually after attaining six hours of continuing education.

3) Limited certificates are no longer issued.



Standard Certificates Suspended

Standard Certificates must be renewed annually by July 1 after attaining six (6) hours of Continuing Education (CE). For FYE 2023, 610 standard certificates were not renewed and suspended. Because many CEOs hold multiple certificates in B, M, E, P it appears there are about 40 individuals that did not renew multiple certificates. The greatest number of suspended certificates is for Fire at 245 with about 90 for B, M and P and 80 for E.



Investigations – Completed Since Last Report: 5




Tommy Green and Chris McLamb have left their positions as investigators for other opportunities. Their positions have posted, closed, and are awaiting interviews.
